  - a. Providing take home literacy and math materials.

- b. Providing online access to literacy and math materials.
- c. Providing online access to resources through the school library site.
- 3. The school will, with the assistance of its schools and parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, Principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:

Conducting annual training at the school level on strategies to increase parent involvement.

- 4.
