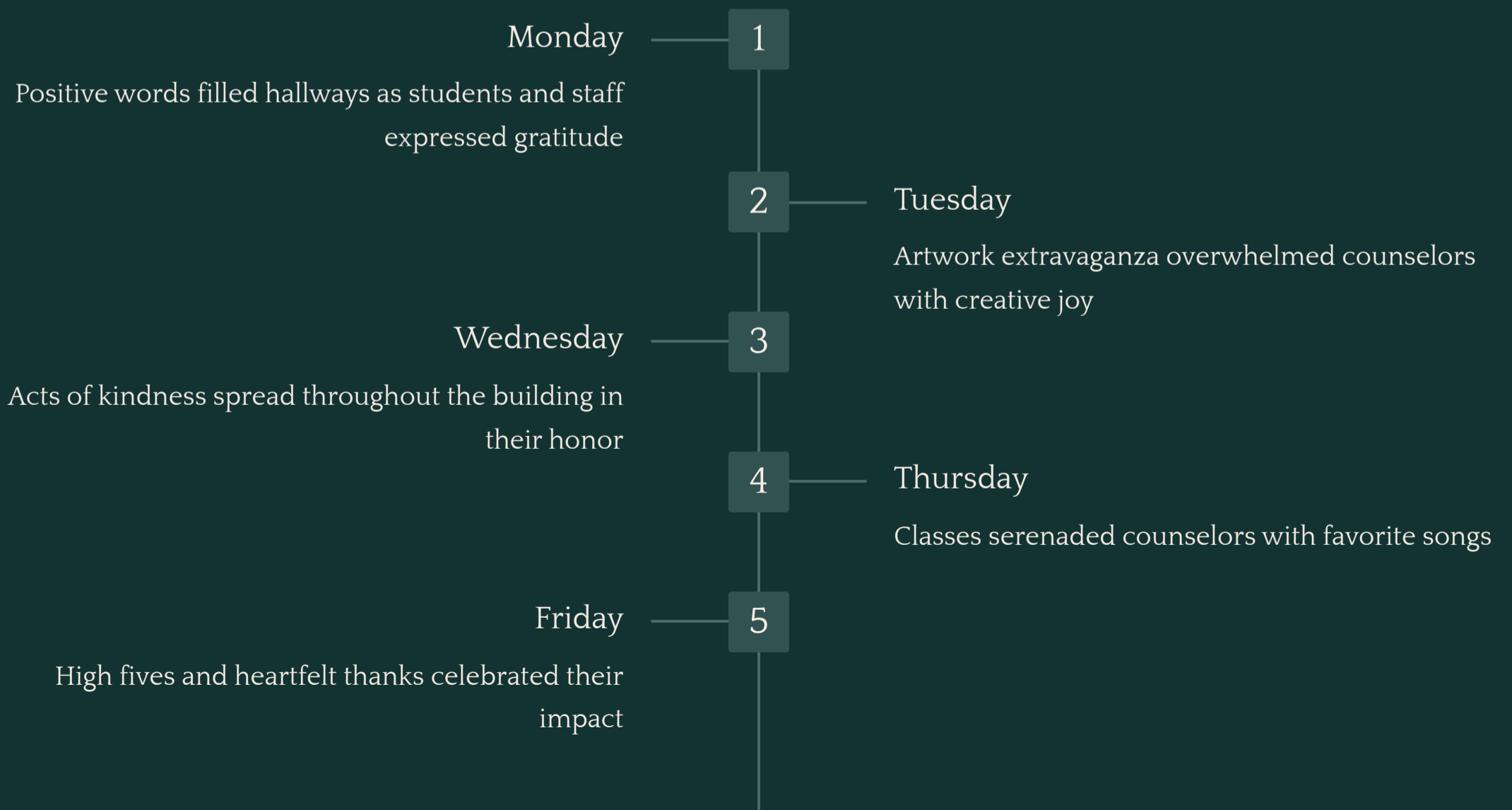

Each class selected a nation, learning its culture and wearing colors with pride

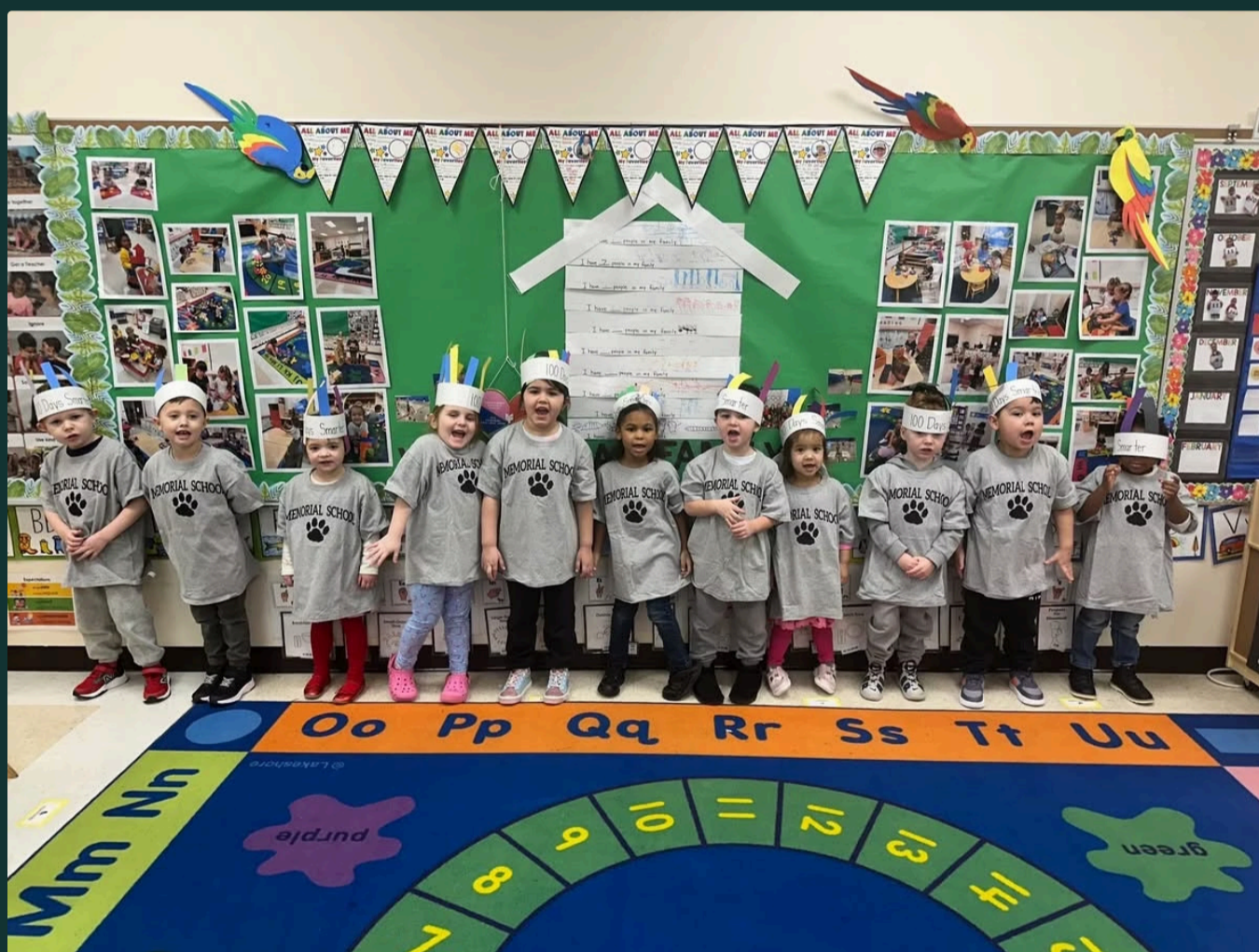

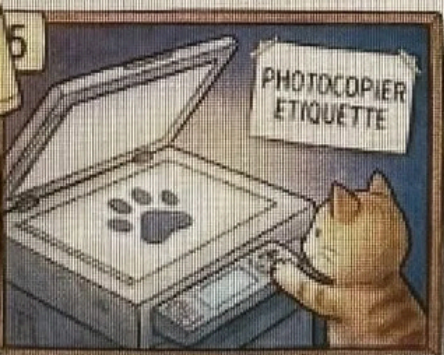
