- Specialized professional development for nurses, CST, guidance, speech, and special area staff, including DOE updates, assistive technology, and subject-specific applications of Al.

03 NJSLA (Adaptive)

What is It?

The New Jersey Student Learning Assessments (NJSLA) have been updated for the 2025–2026 school year. The most significant change is that the assessment is now computer-adaptive, meaning the test automatically adjusts the difficulty of questions based on student responses. This adaptive design allows for a more accurate measure of student performance in Language Arts & Mathematics while minimizing time spent on items that are too easy or too difficult.

Why in the Fall?

The New Jersey Department of Education requires all districts to administer a fall field test this year to ensure the adaptive platform functions effectively and provides reliable results.
